


Mobile Phone Phrasal Verbs



GET OFF: stop talking on the phone

BREAK UP: become inaudible over the telephone because of interference

SCROLL DOWN: move down the screen

PHONE IN: phone the place where you work in order to tell your employer something

RUN OUT OF: use all of something and not have any left

TOP UP: buy more minutes for your cell phone, add credit to your phone (British English)

CHARGE UP: put electricity into a piece of electrical equipment such as a battery

PLUG IN: to connect a piece of equipment to an electricity supply or to another piece of equipment
